Even if the objection is filed, a claim will be barred at the expiration of one (1) year from the date the claim is filed if the claim has not been paid, settled, or otherwise disposed of, and no proceeding is then pending for the enforcement or compulsory payment of it. *See Section 733.709, Florida Statutes.*
